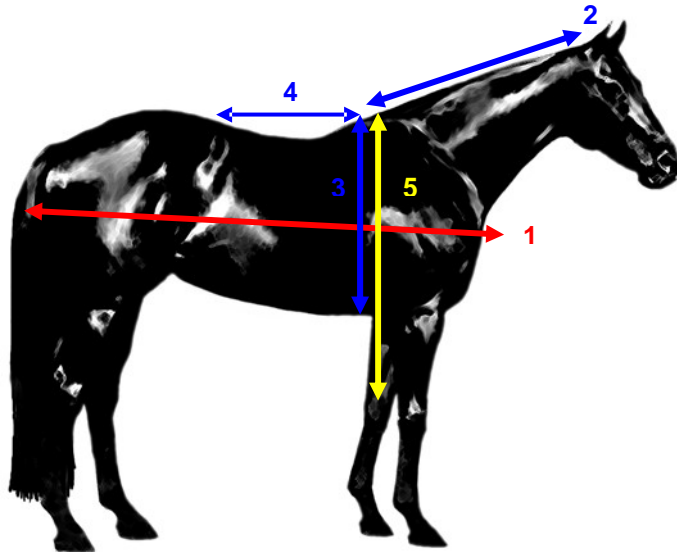


MEASURING YOUR HORSE FOR A GOOD FIT



Some folks find it easier to use a string or baling twine to take these measurements and then measure the string. Always double check all measurements needed.

If you get an odd number, please round up one digit.

Sidenote: Please take the time to re-measure your horse even if you already have a "sized" item for him. We have found that sizes actually vary from manufacturer to manufacturer. Or, an item might have shrunk and now fits your new horse. If you rely on the tag, the new one you order might not fit. Better to be safe than disappointed.

It's always best to measure!

Stand the horse squarely. Look at the horse carefully from the side to determine the bulkiest part of his chest and rump.

1. Measure from the center of the chest around the widest part of the shoulder and hindquarters to the edge of the tail. This is the most critical measurement for a standard cooler or blanket.
2. For high rise coolers, you'll also need to measure from the poll to the top of the withers.
3. Depending on how you describe your horse, we may ask you for the heart girth measurement. This is from the highest point of the withers to just behind the knee – all the way around! We need the circumference.
4. If your horse is very compact from end to end, let us know by measuring his back,
5. Sometimes cooler length needs to be taken. Measure from the top of the withers to the point where the cooler hem will be.
